□ **Important Guidelines regarding Subject Combinations:**

1. The subject combinations are liable to change as per the latest Panjab University instructions. The latest instructions will be displayed on the college notice board.
2. There are limited seats in each subject and the subject will be offered on the basis of merit/first come first served basis, according to the Admission Schedule of this college.
3. Change of combination is allowed within one month of admission to B.A I and it is subject to the availability of seats in the subject to be taken up.
4. With the permission of the principal, seats in Music (I), Music (V) and Sanskrit can be adjusted for the students who have studied these subjects in 10+2 or equivalent examination.
5. Only those students who have passed 10+2 examination with minimum of 40% marks in Mathematics can opt for Mathematics.

Eligibility for taking up the subject of Physical Education

1. Physical Education can be taken up by those students who have either studied the subject in the previous class or have participated in Inter School / State / Open State tournaments. Certificates in this regard should be produced at the time of interview.
2. As per the new guidelines of the Panjab University, the admission of students in Physical Education shall be finalised after conducting a Physical Fitness Test. The subject will be offered to physically fit students.
3. The admission to sports quota (i.e. 2%) will be done on the basis of gradation issued by the appropriate authority.
4. The practical class is compulsory as per the Dept. /College time table.

Add-on-Course

One Year Certificate Course in Travel and Tourism

The college is offering this course as per the rules and regulations of the Panjab University under the aegis of the Departments of History and Geography of this college.

No. of seats is 30.

Eligibility: 10+2 in any stream.

Fee : As per P.U. Fee Structure

Scope and Potential:

It is estimated that around seven million new job opportunities will arise in the next ten years. The Add-on-Course on Travel and Tourism will fully arm the students to handle the travel, tour, hospitality and various other segments related to Tourism Industry.

B.A. II (Honours) – A student can offer Honours. in B.A.II in Economics, Hindi, Public Administration, Punjabi, Psychology, History and Geography.

(Eligibility: Minimum 45% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in pass course in the concerned subject).

B. Com.

1. The list of subjects to be studied in B.Com I, II & III is available under the Bachelor of Commerce category in the common portion of the prospectus.
2. In B.Com III, a student can choose either Operations Research or Organisational Behaviour as one of the optional subjects.

B.Com II & III (Honours)

Eligibility: Minimum 50% marks in the aggregate.

A student can offer Honours in the subject of:

- Business Finance and Accounting.
- E-Commerce
- Business Economics.

B.C.A.

B.C.A I, II & III list of subjects is available under the Self Financing Courses category of the common portion of the prospectus **M.Com. (Semester System)**

Eligibility

- (a) A bachelor's degree in Commerce with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate; OR
- (b) B.Com (Hons) degree with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate; OR
- (c) A bachelor's degree with Honours in Economics OR Mathematics OR Statistics OR Commerce with not less than 45% in the aggregate; OR
- (d) A bachelor's degree with 50% marks in the aggregate having offered either Economics, Mathematics, Statistics or Commerce as a subject in the examination.

In case of a candidate having Bachelor's degree of the University through Modern Indian Language [Hindi/Urdu/Punjabi/Gurmukhi Script] and/ or in a Classical Language (Sanskrit/ Persian/Arabic) or degree of any other University obtained in the same manner recognized by the Syndicate; 50% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in Language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together; OR

- (e) An associate of the (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or England or (ii) Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India or England; OR
- (f) A pass in the final examination conducted by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India; OR
- (g) Any other qualification recognized by the Syndicate for this purpose:

A candidate who seeks admission on the basis of qualifications mentioned in (c), (d), and (e) above shall be required to qualify a special examination in two papers on (i) Commercial and Taxation Laws, and (ii) Accounting and Auditing, within one year from the date of Admission (either with Semester I examination or with Semester II examination), in accordance with the Syllabus as may be prescribed by the Senate. Further, the maximum marks shall be 100 in each paper and the pass marks shall be 35% as in B.Com. examination. There shall be no internal assessment in these papers and marks in these papers will not be counted for the Semester examination.

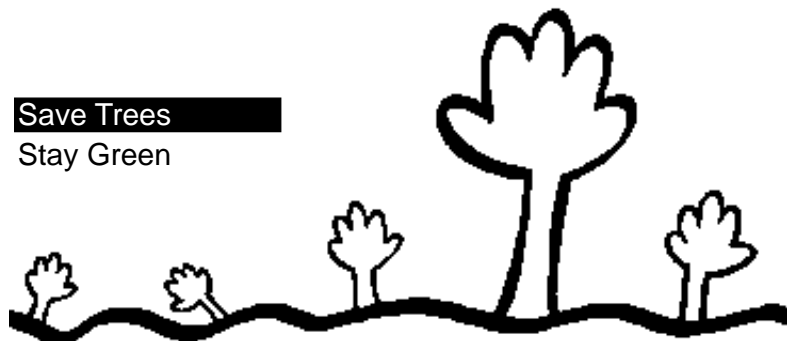
